














## Australian Native Flavours

Acronychia acidula	Lemon aspin	4x3m	Medium shrub producing white lemon flavoured fruit	N/A	14cm pot		
Apium annumm	Sea Celery	Erect/ 60cm	A mineral rich native herb that grows around the coast of southern Australia, Tasting much like traditional celery. Both stems and leaves can be used in cooking		10cm punets		
Apium prostratum	Sea Parsley (Fine Leaf Form)	20cmx40cm	A good native substitute to common parsley, growing in coastal regions of southern and eastern Australia		10cm punets		
Austromyrtus Dulcis	Midyim berry	1x1m	An attractive small shrub with edible berries, cream flowers and bronze new growth,		14cm pot		
Arthropodium milliflorum	Vanilla Lilly	60cm	Blue green grass like foliage with small mauve and white flowers that have a vanilla aroma. It produces clumps of edible tubers.	NA			
Atriplex Nummularia	Old man saltbush	3x3m	Fast growing, with blue green foliage used in cooking or feeding stock as a forage shrub.		7cm tube		
Mentha australis	River Mint	40cm	Growing on runners this mint is best contained in tubs or pots unless it is free to spread across the ground. Sought after in herb mixes or in tea.		10cm punets		
Tetragonia tetragoniodes	Warragul Greens	Ground Cover	A native spinach that can be used similarly to traditional spinach.	NA	10cm punets		
Arthropodium strictum	Chocolate Lily	60cm	Producing edible tubers similar to the Vanilla lily, but smells like chocolate and has an attractive bright blue flower.	NA	7cm tube		

Bulbine bulbosa	Bulbine Lily	40cm	An attractive spike of bright yellow flowers while producing an edible bulb similar to a leek.		7cm tube		
Enchylaena tomentos	Ruby Saltbush	Prostrate	A low spreading shrub with blueish grey foliage and bright pink edible berries		7cm tube		
Prostanthera rotundifolia	Roundleaf Mint	3X2m	This shrub produces masses of bright purple flowers while the leaves can be used for Flavouring with a strong mint flavour		7cm tube		
Prostanthera incisa	Cut Leaf Mint	1.5X1.5	Again producing mauve flowers in spring while very aromatic foliage is used as a flavouring.		7cm tube		
Backhousia citriadora	Lemon Myrtle	5-8m	Growing much smaller in southern regions but still producing strong lemon flavoured leaves that can be used green or dried to make tea or flavour in cooking.		14cm pot		
Backhousia annisata	Anise Myrtle	8X4m	Aniseed flavoured leaves, ideal for use while cooking or making deserts.		N/A		
Caposma quadrifida	native current bush	3x3m	sweet tasting currents used for jams or desert topping		7cm tube		
Capibrotus rossii	Karkalla	10cmx3m	Spreading succulent with Purple flowers that develop sweet edible fruit		7cm tube		
Chamelaucium uncinatum	Geralton Wax	4X3	Apart from the use as a very attractive cut flower the leaves are also used as flavouring when cooking.		14cm pot		
Cymbopogon ambiguus	Australian lemon grass	.5-.8m	Attractive lemon flavoured grass with blue grey foliage. The foliage is crushed or cut to use as a lemon flavoured herb.		7&14cm		

Eucalyptus olida	Strawberry Gum	10mx4m	Attractive new growth with leaves having a strawberry flavour used for oil production or dried for flavouring.		14cm pot		
Kunzea pomifera	Muntries	0.2m-1m x 2m	Often the prostrate form is trellised where the shrub form is more upright to about a metre. The fruit looks and tastes like little apples. Ideal for use in jams and chutney.		7cm tube

Tasmania lanceolata	Mountain Pepper: Male/Female	2-3m	Both Berries and leaves are sought after for their peppery flavour that can be used as a dried herb or green infused in cooking.		14cm pot		
Microseris lanceolata	Yam Daisy (Murnong)	20cm	Eatable roots that look much like small parsnip.	N/A	7cm tube
